Application Procedure

1. Apply for admission to Professional Golf Management Program or a School of Agronomy to be a Green Superintendent
2. Obtain an application from Mr. Masterson
3. Have your coach sign your application and write a letter of recommendation
4. Obtain a letter from the Golf Professional at the course where you play most of your golf
5. Write a short essay (no more than one page) "How I plan to pursue a career in a golf-related field"
6. Return completed application and all related letters to the Jon M. Pritsch Memorial Fund, P.O. Box 2086, Brick, NJ 08723

Applications and letters must be received by 5:00 PM, May 15, 2009.

- Demonstrate outstanding performance in one of the above categories
- Document a track record of achievements relevant to entry category
- Hold a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Have received at least one award related to their entry category

In addition, all scholarship winners will be required to supply documentation of the following:

- US citizenship
- Acceptance to an accredited US college
- Enrollment in college in the fall 2009 semester
